



The John Maclean Prize

The Prize was endowed in December 1923, by Professor Sir Ewen J Maclean MD, in memory of his father, the late John Maclean of Kilmoluag, Tiree, and of Mount Hill, Carmarthen. It consists of a medal.¹

1. The Prize will be awarded annually, in case of sufficient merit, to the candidate for the degrees of Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery, who, having pursued in the Cardiff University School of Medicine, the course of study in Midwifery and Gynaecology approved as part of the qualifying scheme for those degrees and satisfied the examiners in the subject in the examination held by the Institution, has, in the opinion of UWRET, shown the greatest proficiency in it.
2. In making the award, UWRET will take into account a report of the external examiner on the attainments of the candidates in the examination and a report of the Professor of Obstetrics and Gynaecology on the work of the candidates during their period of study of the subject.
3. If the successful candidate shall not have completed the qualification for the degrees of Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery, the publication of the award and the presentation of the Prize will be deferred until he/she shall complete the qualification.

These regulations are formed on the basis of the original bequest. When making an award, Trustees may apply discretion and interpret the bequest for modern times.

1. A cash sum, subject to available funds, is now awarded in place of a medal
