

## The Thomas Ellis Memorial Fund

The fund was raised by public subscription and was transferred to the University of Wales as Trustee to perpetuate the memory of the late Thomas Edward Ellis MA, Warden of the Guild of Graduates (1896-1899), and a Member of Parliament representing Merioneth during the years 1886-1899.

- 1. The annual income of the Fund shall be applied in making grants to assist research into the language, literature, history and antiquities of Wales and Monmouthshire and the publication of the results of such research.
- 2. Persons engaged in such research may make application to UWRET on forms supplied for the purpose and should state the nature of the research and the sum required for its prosecution or for the publication of its results. They should also furnish evidence as to character, capacity, and qualifications for research.
- 3. Persons receiving grants shall preferably, but not necessarily, be members of a Welsh University.
- 4. Persons receiving a grant in aid of the publication of any work shall include in such work as published an acknowledgement of their indebtedness to UWRET and the Thomas Ellis Memorial Fund.
- 5. Applications should be sent to UWRET, University of Wales Registry, Cathays Park, Cardiff CF10 3NS, by 1 June.<sup>2</sup>

These regulations are formed on the basis of the original bequest. When making an award, Trustees may apply discretion and interpret the bequest for modern times.

Any reference in these regulations to 'Welsh Universities' (or a 'Welsh university') shall mean former accredited institutions of the University of Wales or other Universities registered in Wales.

- 1. The actual value of each award will be subject to available funds.
